


Kyss Bags Embroidery Design Tips

We want you to LOVE your new bag and your embroidery design so here are a few tips we can offer when choosing your embroidery.

Tip #1

Text Color - Although the color of the bag handles is black, we can suggest that you select a name or text color that matches one of the colors in your embroidered image and stands out nicely against the background color of your bag. People generally seem happier with vibrant colored text instead of black, but the choice is up to you.

Tip #2

Image Designs that Include Text - If you choose an image design that includes text, consider the default color of the text (as shown on the website) and how it will show up against the color of the bag. Use the "Special Instructions" to request a substitute color that will contrast nicely against the background color of the bag.

Tip #3

ALL CAPITAL LETTERS - If you'd like all capital letters for your name or text, we suggest that you choose either Albertus Bold or Klimenkos Fancy for your font. All-capital names or other words are generally hard to read in the script-style fonts.

Tip #4

MONOGRAMS & INITIALS - All 4 of our fonts are great for Monograms and Initials, but there are some capital letters in each of the fonts that are a little unorthodox and may not be to your liking. Here is a list of those unorthodox letters:

ALBERTUS BOLD

- "J" - Particularly thin compared to the other letters

DIANNE SCRIPT

- "H" - Looks a lot like "K"
- "I" - Could be mistaken for a "J"

KLIMENKOS FANCY

- "E" - Looks a lot like a large "e"
- "J" - Particularly thin compared to the other letters

SPORT SCRIPT

- "I" - Looks like a thin loop
- "L" - Top is curled over to the right
- "T" - Could be mistaken for an "I"
